ORDINANCE NO. 02-01-01-42

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 6.14 OF CHAPTER 6, MUNICIPAL CODE OF LE ROY, ILLINOIS, 1975 (as amended)

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Le Roy, McLean County, Illinois, an Illinois municipal corporation, have determined that it is in the best interests of the City and of its residents to make improvements to the city water treatment and distribution system; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Le Roy find that current user fees for distribution and use of water treated and pumped by the city to the users are not sufficient to permit the necessary improvements to the treatment and distribution system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Le Roy, Illinois, in lawful meeting assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section 6.14 of Chapter 6 of the Municipal Code of Le Roy, Illinois, 1975 (as amended), and Section 2 of Ordinance No. 745 adopted August 15, 1997, are hereby repealed effective January 31, 2002.

- Section 2. New section 6.14 of Chapter 6 of the Municipal Code of Le Roy, Illinois, 1975 (as amended), is hereby adopted in words and figures as follows:
- 6.14a WATER RATES. The water rates for all in city residential and business meters effective with the first meter reading after February 1, 2002 shall be as follows:
 - \$3.75 minimum for the first 1000 gallons used; and
 - \$3.75 for each 1,000 gallons beyond the minimum quantity.

The water rates for meters serving more than one single family unit or more than one business, or combination thereof, shall be:

- \$3.75 multiplied by the number of individual family units or businesses served from the meter to determine the minimum monthly charge; and
- \$3.75 for each 1,000 gallons beyond the minimum quantity used (as measured through the meter, regardless of the number of individual family units or businesses served from the meter).

- 6.14b WATER RATES. The water rates for all in city residential and business meters effective with the first meter reading after February 1, 2003 shall be as follows:
 - \$4.30 minimum for the first 1000 gallons used; and
 - \$4.30 for each 1,000 gallons beyond the minimum quantity.

The water rates for meters serving more than one single family unit or more than one business, or combination thereof, shall be:

- \$4.30 multiplied by the number of individual family units or businesses served from the meter to determine the minimum monthly charge; and
- \$4.30 for each 1,000 gallons beyond the minimum quantity used (as measured through the meter, regardless of the number of individual family units or businesses served from the meter).
- 6.14c WATER RATES. The water rates for all in city residential and business meters effective with the first meter reading after February 1, 2004 shall be as follows:
 - \$4.95 minimum for the first 1000 gallons used; and
 - \$4.95 for each 1,000 gallons beyond the minimum quantity.

The water rates for meters serving more than one single family unit or more than one business, or combination thereof, shall be:

- \$4.95 multiplied by the number of individual family units or businesses served from the meter to determine the minimum monthly charge; and
- \$4.95 for each 1,000 gallons beyond the minimum quantity used (as measured through the meter, regardless of the number of individual family units or businesses served from the meter).

One hundred percent (100%) will be added to the above rates to metered customers outside the corporate limits of the City of Le Roy.

Section 3. Effective February 1, 2005, water user fees will be increased based on the Consumer Price Index All Urban Consumers (CPI-U). Any adjustment will be made effective with the first meter reading after February 1 and will be in effect for one year. The consumer price index inflation rate will be evaluated on an annual basis each February and adjustments will be made accordingly.

<u>Section 4.</u> All ordinances, or parts thereof, and all resolutions, or parts thereof, in conflict with this ordinance shall be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect as set forth hereafter.

<u>Section 5.</u> Nothing in this ordinance hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or any liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 4 of this ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

<u>Section 6.</u> This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
