ORDINANCE NO. 18-06-01-90

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING PREVAILING WAGE RATES TO BE PAID TO LABORERS, MECHANICS AND OTHER WORKERS PERFORMING CONSTRUCTION OF PUBLIC WORKS IN THE CITY OF LEROY, MCLEAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted the Prevailing Wage Act, approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being 820 ILCS 130/0.01 through 130/12 ("Act"); and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that during the month of June of each calendar year the City Council of the City of Le Roy ("City") investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages, as defined in said Act, in the "locality" of the City for laborers, mechanics and other workers performing construction of public works for the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Le Roy, McLean County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1 To the extent and as required by the Act, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workers engaged in the construction of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the City is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in McLean County as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois (the "Department") which are in effect on August 31, 2017. If the Department adopts different rates after June 1, 2018 during the month of June, 2018, a copy of that determination will be appended hereto and incorporated herein by reference when it is available from the Department. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department shall supersede the Department's

June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the City.

The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the Act shall be the same as the definitions specified in the Act.

- **Section 2.** Nothing herein contained is intended to apply nor shall be construed to apply said prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment performed on behalf of this City except public works construction to the extent required by the Act.
- **Section 3.** If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any of the other provisions of this Ordinance.
- **Section 4.** All Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
- **Section 5.** The City Clerk shall publicly post or keep available for inspection by any interested party in the main office of this City this determination of prevailing rate of wages. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.
- **Section 6.** By July 15th, the City Clerk shall file a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Illinois Department of Labor.
- **Section 7.** Within thirty (30) days after filing a certified copy of this Ordinance with the Department of Labor, the City Clerk shall cause to be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the area a notice that this determination is effective and constitutes the

determination of this public body or by a hyperlink posted to the Department's determination in accordance with 820 ILCS 130/9.

Section 8. The City Clerk shall mail a copy of this Ordinance to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workers whose wages will be affected by such rates.

Section 9. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
