AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PREVAILING WAGE RATE FOR PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF LE ROY, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and City Council of the City of LeRoy, Illinois:

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being Paragraphs 39s-1 et. seq., as amended by Public Acts 86-799 and 86-693, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1989 (as amended), and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the Mayor and City Council of the City of LeRoy investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workmen in the locality of said City of LeRoy employed in performing construction of public works, for said City of LeRoy,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LE ROY, ILLINOIS:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body of any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workmen engaged in the construction (including maintenance work) of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the City of LeRoy, Illinois, is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the McLean County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June of 1990, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the City of LeRoy. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction (including maintenance work) of the City of LeRoy, Illinois, to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The City Clerk for the City of LeRoy shall publicly post or keep available for inspection, by any interested party in the main office of the City of LeRoy, Illinois, this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of the prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The City Clerk of the City of LeRoy shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person

or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workmen whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk of the City of LeRoy shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State Index Division and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as required by law.

IRONWORKERS E That part of the county East of a diagonal line from Hayworth to a point half way between Chenoa and Weston. ELECTRICIANS E Townships of Cropsey, Anchor, Cheney Grove and Bellflower.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply:

New Years Day, Memorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day.

Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION-MCLEAN COUNTY-Except North

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axle trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehousemen, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or men to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 6,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axle trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axle combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axle trucks hauling 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, mechanics and working foremen, and dispatchers.

Five axle or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Oil Distributors.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION-MCLEAN COUNTY-North

Class 1. A-frame truck when used for transportation purposes; Air Compressors and Welding Machines, including those pulled by cars, pick-up trucks and tractors; Ambulances; Batch Gate Lockers; Batch Hopperman; Car and Truck Washers; Carry Alls; Fork Lifts and Hoisters; Helpers; Mechanics Helpers and Greasers; Oil Distributors, 2-man operation; Payement Breakers; Pole Trailer, upto 40 Feet; Power Mower Tractors; Self-Propelled Chip Spreader; Shipping and receiving Clerks and Checkers; Skipman; Slurry Trucks, 2-man operation; Slurry Trucks, Conveyor Operated - 2 or 3-man operation; Teamsters, Unskilled Dumpmen Warehousemen and Dockmen; Truck Drivers hauling warning lights, barricades, and portable toilets on the job site.

Class 2. Dispatcher; Dump Crets and Adgetors under 7 yards; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnapulls or Turnatrailers when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment under 16 cubic yards; Mixer Trucks under 7 yards; Ready-Mix Plant Hopper Operator; Winch Trucks, 2 Axles.

Class 3. Cump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or Turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards. Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Dil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; additional 50¢ per hour; Slurry Trucks, 1-man operation; Winch Trucks, 3 axles or more; Mechanic - Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Asphalt Plant Operators in areas where it has been past practice Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

Class 2. Dinkeys; Power Launches; PH One-pass Soil Cement Machine (and similar types); Pugmill with Pump; Backfillers; Euclid Loader; Forklifts; Jeeps w/Ditching Machine or other attachments; Tuneluger; Automatic Cement and Gravel Batching Plants; Mobile Drills (Soil Testing) and similar types; Gurries and Similar Types); (1) and (2) Drum Hoists (Buck Hoist and Similar Types); Chicago Boom; Boring Machine & Pipe Jacking Machine; Hydro Boom; Dewatering System; Straw Blower; Hydro Seeder; Assistant Heavy Equipment Greaser on Spread; Tractors (Irack type) without Power Unit pulling Rollers; Rollers on Asphalt - Brick Macadem; Concrete Breakers; Concrete Spreaders; Mule Pulling Rollers; Center Stripper; Cement Finishing Machines & CMI Texture & Reel Curing Machines; Cement Finishing Machine; Barber Green or similar loaders; Vibro Tamper (All similar types) Self-propelled; Winch or Boom Truck; Mechanical Bull Floats; Mixers over 3 Bag to 27E; Tractor pulling Power Blade or Elevating Grader; Porter Rex Rail; Clary Screed; Truck Uppe Hoptoe Oilers; Fireman; Spray Machine on Paving; Curb Machines; Truck Crane Oilers; Oil Distributor; 3-4 Small Equipment; Oiler and one (1) small equipment.

Class 3. Air Compressor (1) or (2); Power Subgrader; Straight Tractor; Trac Air without attachments; Herman Nelson Heater, Dravo, Warner, Silent Glo, and similar types, One Engineer will operate 1-5 and after 5, two Operators will be required; Self-propelled Concrete Saws; Roller: Five (5) Ton and under on Earth or Gravel; Form Grader; Crawler Crane & Skid Rig Oilers; Freight Elevators; Pump (1) or (2); Light Plant (1) or (2); Generator (3.5 KW and Over) (1) or (2); Conveyor (1) or (2) - Operator will clean; Welding Machine (1) or (2) - Equal 300 Amp. or Over (Not to include electric welders); Mixer (3) Bag and Under (Standard Capacity with skip); Bulk Cement Plant; Oiler on Central Concrete Mixing Plant.

Class 3. Trac Air Machine (without attachments); Herman Melson Heater, Dravo Warner, Silent Glo & similar types; Self-propelled Concrete Saws; Crawler Crane and Skid Rig Offers; Rollers - five ton and under on earth and gravel; Form Graders; Pump (1) or (2); Light Plant (1) or (2); Generator (1) or (2); Air Compressor (1) or (2); Conveyor (1) or (2) - Operator will clean; Welding Machine (1) or (2); Mixer - 3 bags and under; Bulk Cement Plant; Oilers on Workboat (over 100 hp).

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If there is no such definition on file, the Bureau of Labor Statistics SIC list will be used. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. Further, if no such neighboring county nate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination.

Prevailing rates of wages have been determined for the following classifications which may not be listed: barber, hairdresser and cosmetologist; baker; bartender; cook (Cook, Sangamon); elevator operator; food service worker (Cook, Sangamon, U of I-C); furniture mover (Cook); janitor (Cook, Macon); maintenance worker-power plant; millwright; moving picture machine operator; operating engineer-stationary or hazardous waste, sewage disposal and water plant, floating platform; patrol officer (Cook); piledriver; railroad construction and maintenance worker; security guard; stationary fireman; sound technician; telecommunication service technician; theatrical stage employee; tug boat operator; underwater diver; well drillers. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217/782/1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF LABOR PREVAILING WAGES FOR MCLEAN COUNTY EFFECTIVE 06/01/90

These Prevailing Wages shall be included in the contracts and their advertised specifications to which any public body, as defined in Section 2 of the Prevailing Wage Act (Ill. Rev. Stat. 1987, Ch. 48, par. 39s-1), is a party, for the construction, reconstruction, maintenance and/or repair of public buildings or public works within the State of Illinois which requires or involves the employment of laborers, workers, and mechanics, and owner/operators. Minimum wages, overtime rate and fringe benefits certified herein shall be paid. This scale of prevailing wages to be paid shall be posted by the contractor in a prominent and easily accessible place at the site of work. This determination is the property of the Illinois Department of Labor and shall not be altered without their consent in writing.
