ORDINANCE NO.	844

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE PREVAILING WAGE RATE FOR PUBLIC WORKS OF THE CITY OF LE ROY, MC LEAN COUNTY, ILLINOIS

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of LeRoy, McLean County, Illinois:

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois has enacted "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body or any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, being 820 ILCS 130/0.01, et seq., Illinois Compiled Statutes 1996 State Bar Edition (as amended) (formerly cited as Paragraphs 39s-l, et seq., as amended by Public Acts 86-799 and 86-693, Chapter 48, Illinois Revised Statutes, 1991 (as amended)), and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid Act requires that the City Council of the City of LeRoy investigate and ascertain the prevailing rate of wages as defined in said Act for laborers, mechanics and other workmen in the locality of said City of LeRoy employed in performing construction of public works, for said City of LeRoy,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of LeRoy, Illinois:

SECTION 1: To the extent and as required by "An Act regulating wages of laborers, mechanics and other workmen employed in any public works by the State, County, City or any public body of any political subdivision or by any one under contract for public works," approved June 26, 1941, as amended, the general prevailing rate of wages in this locality for laborers, mechanics and other workmen engaged in the construction (including maintenance work) of public works coming under the jurisdiction of the City of LeRoy, McLean County, Illinois, is hereby ascertained to be the same as the prevailing rate of wages for construction work in the McLean County area as determined by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois as of June 1, 1999, a copy of that determination being attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. As required by said Act, any and all revisions of the prevailing rate of wages by the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois shall supersede the Department's June determination and apply to any and all public works construction undertaken by the City of LeRoy, McLean County, Illinois. The definition of any terms appearing in this Ordinance which are also used in the aforesaid Act shall be the same as in said Act.

SECTION 2: Nothing herein contained shall be construed to apply said general prevailing rate of wages as herein ascertained to any work or employment except public works construction (including maintenance work) of the City of LeRoy, McLean County, Illinois, to the extent required by the aforesaid Act.

SECTION 3: The City Clerk for the City of LeRoy shall publicly post or keep available for inspection, by any interested party in the main office of the City of LeRoy, Illinois, this determination or any revisions of such prevailing rate of wage. A copy of this determination or of the current revised determination of the prevailing rate of wages then in effect shall be attached to all contract specifications.

SECTION 4: The City Clerk of the City of LeRoy shall mail a copy of this determination to any employer, and to any association of employers and to any person or association of employees who have filed, or file their names and addresses, requesting copies of any determination stating the particular rates and the particular class of workmen whose wages will be affected by such rates.

SECTION 5: The City Clerk of the City of LeRoy shall promptly file a certified copy of this Ordinance with both the Secretary of State Index Division and the Department of Labor of the State of Illinois.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as required by law.

FENCE ERECTOR - See Ironworkers.

IRONWORKERS (EAST) - That part of the county East of a diagonal line from Heyworth to a point half way between Chenca and Weston.

TEAMSTERS (MORTH) - North of a straight line starting on the west side where Route 24 crosses McClean County line in a southeasterly direction to the most south-southwestern corner of Livingston County.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply:

New Years Day, Memorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASSESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material from any place in a building, including mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ABBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

TELECON WORKER

Class 1. Installing, assembling and maintaining sound and intercom, protection alarm (security), master antenna television, closed circuit television, computer hardware and software programming and installation to the network's outlet and input (EXCLUDING all cabling, power and cable termination work historically performed by wiremen), door monitoring and control, nurse and emergency call programming and installation to the system's putlet and input (EXCLUDING all cabling, power and cable termination work historically performed by wiremen), clock and timing; and the installation and maintenance of transmit and receive antennas, transmitters, receivers, and associated apparatus which operates in conjunction with the above systems. All work associated with these system installations will be included EXCEPT (1) installation of protective metallic conduit, excluding less than ten-foot runs strictly for protection of cable, and (2) 120 volt AC (or higher) power wiring and associated hardware.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION - SOUTH

Class 1. Drivers on 2 axis trucks hauling less than 9 ton. Air compressor and welding machines and brooms, including those pulled by separate units, truck driver helpers, warehouse employees, mechanic helpers, greasers and tiremen, pickup trucks when hauling materials, tools, or workers to and from and on-the-job site, and fork lifts up to 5,000 lb. capacity.

Class 2. Two or three axis trucks hauling more than 9 ton but hauling less than 16 ton. A-frame winch trucks, hydrolift trucks, vactor trucks or similar equipment when used for transportation purposes. Fork lifts over 6,000 lb. capacity, winch trucks, four axis combination units, and ticket writers.

Class 3. Two, three or four axis trucks hading 16 ton or more. Drivers on water pulls, articulated dump trucks, mechanics and working foreparsons, and dispatchers. Five axis or more combination units.

Class 4. Low Boy and Gil Distributors.

Class 5. Drivers who require special protective clothing while employed on hazardous waste work.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION - NORTH

Class 1. Two or three Axie Trucks. A-frame Truck when used for transportation purposes; Air Compressors and Welding Machines, including those pulled by cars, pick-up trucks and tractors; Ambulances; Batch Gate Lockers; Batch Hopperman; Car and Truck Washers; Carry-alla; Fork Lifts and Hoisters; Helpers; Mechanics Helpers and Greasers; Cil Distributors 2-man operation; Pavement Breakers; Pole Trailer, up to 40 feet; Power Mower Tractors; Self-propelled Chip Spreader; Skipman; Slurry Trucks, 2-man operation; Slurry Truck Conveyor Operation, 2 or 3 man; Teasters; Unskilled dumpman; and Truck Drivers hauling warning lights, berricades, and portable toilets on the job site.

Class 7. Four axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors under 7 yards; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Sug Bottom Dump Turnspulls or Turnstrailers when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment under 16 cubic yards; Mixer Trucks under 7 yeards; Ready-mix Plant Ropper Operator, and Winch Trucks, 2 Axles.

Class 1. Five axia trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or turnapulis when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 15 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Sturry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more; Machanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axls trucks; Dusl-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING

Class 1. Cranes; Overhead Cranes; Gradell; All Cherry Pickers; Mechanics; Central Concrete Mixing Plant Operator; Moad Pavers (27% - Dual Drum - Tri Batchers); Blacktop Plant Operators and Plant Engineers; J Drum Hoist; Oerricks; Hydro Cranes; Shovels; Skimmer Scoops; Koehring Scooper; Drag Lines; Backhoe; Derrick Boats; Pile Drivers and Skid Rigs; Clamehells; Locomotive Cranes; Dradge (all types) Motor Patrol; Power Blades - Dumore - Elevating and similar types; Tower Cranes (Crawler-Hobile) and Stationary; Crane-type Backfiller; Drott Yumbo and similar types considered as Cranes; Caiseon Rigs; Dozer; Tournadovar; Work Boats; Ross Carrier; Helicopter; Tournapulls - all and similar types; Scoops (all sizes); Pushcats; Endloaders (all types); Asphalt Surfacing Machine; Slip Form Paver; Rock Crusher; Heavy Equipment Grasser; CMI. CMI Belt Placer, Auto Grade 4 D Track and similar types; Side Booms; Multiple Unit Earth Movers; Creter Crane; Trench Machine; Pump-crete-Belt Crates-Screw-type Pumpe and Cypsum; Bulker & Pump - Operator will clean; Formless Finishing Machine; Flaherty Spreader or similar types; Screed Man on Laydown Machine; Wheel Tractors (industrial or Farm-type W/Dozer-Hoe-Endloader or other attachments); F.W.D. & Similar Types; Vermeet Concrete Saw.

Class Z. Dinkeys; Power Launches; PH One-pass Soil Cement Machine (and similar types); Fugmill with Pump; Backfillers; Euclid Loader; Forklifts; Jasps w/Ditching Machine or other attachments; Tuneluger; Automatic Coment and Gravel Batching Plants; Mobils Drills (Soil Testing) and similar types; Curries and Similar Types; (1) and (2) Drum Hoists (Buck Hoist and Similar Types); Chicago Boom; Boring Machine 6 Pipe Jacking Machine; Bydro Boom; Dewatering System; Straw Blower; Hydro Seeder; Assistant Heavy Equipment Greaser on Spread; Tractors (Track type) without Power Unit pulling Rollers; Rollers on Asphalt -- Brick Macadem; Concrete Breakers; Concrete Spreaders; Mule Pulling Rollers; Center Stripper; Cement Finishing Machines a CMI Texture 6 Real Curing Machines; Cement Finishing Machine; Barber Green or similar loaders; Vibro Tamper (All similar types) Self-propelled; Winch or Boom Truck; Mechanical Bull Floats; Mixers over 3 Bag to 27E; Tractor pulling Power Blade or Sleveting Grader; Porter Rex Rail; Clary Screed; Truck Type Hoptoe Ollers; Fireman; Spray Machine on Paving; Curb Machines; Truck Crane Oilers; Oil Distributor; Truck-Mounted Saws.

Class 3. Straight framed articulating end dump vehicles and Truck mounted vac unit (separately powered); Trac Air Machine (without attachments); Harman Relson Heater, Dravo Warner, Silent Clo & similar types; Hollers - five ton and under on earth and gravel; Form Craders; Pumps; Light Plant; Generator; Air Compressor (1) or (2); Conveyor; Welding Machine; Mixer - 3 bags and under; Bulk Cament Plant; Oilers.

Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If there is no such definition on file, the Bureau of Labor Statistics SIC list will be used. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department wilk upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. Further, if no such neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 618/993-7271 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantaman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.
